#### **Extension Center Sessions**

January and February were busy months for most of the WAAST extension centers. We thank God for our hard-working coordinators and professors! Three professors from the central campus were also privileged to teach in the centers during their sessions.

**DRC**: Twenty-eight students from DRC and 2 from Congo-Brazzaville are currently studying in this center in Kinshasa, coordinated by Revs. Marcel and Cécile Bomboko. Rev. Bernie Smith traveled to teach here in February.

**Ghana**: Twenty-three new students joined the second- and third-year students in January, for a total of about 45. Rev. Phillip Arthur directs this center, based in Kumasi.

**Niger**: In February, Rev. Douti Flindja taught in the center in Niamey, coordinated by Rev. Moussa Ali. Four new students joined the 9 others in the classes.

**Senegal**: Ten students are in the WAAST program in Dakar, directed by Rev. Nicodème Biesse. Rev. Jean Bandé taught in this center in January.
