The 2022 Master of Arts session began on May 9, with 84 students from 12 nations enrolled. Thirty-five first-year students (25 in the French section and 10 in the English) are taking the required core courses. The others are pursuing their chosen concentration: Cross-cultural Ministry, Christian Education, or Counseling (French only), and will end the session with a related practicum and a comprehensive exam. Students benefit from the wide academic and cultural experience of many professors—11 from 4 nations in the English section, and 14 from 7 nations
